

Expectations

- ◆ The Garfield High School Code of Conduct and all Garfield Public School District Policies continue to be in effect during Summer Programs. This includes the District Uniform Dress Code Policy.
- ◆ Garfield High School reserves the right to suspend or remove any student whose conduct is detrimental to the learning process.
- ◆ Any student who by his/her actions or disregard for the educational and discipline policies of the school disrupts the smooth running of the school, will be asked to leave the Summer Program and will receive no credit.
- ◆ Receiving appropriate credit from Garfield High School Summer Programs is contingent upon the student registering in the appropriate courses and performing at an acceptable level in that course.
- ◆ The teacher and administration of the school awards credit based on the performance of the student.

Grades/ Credit

- ◆ Students will receive grades in all course work completed during the Summer Program and credit given accordingly. Grades will be reported through Portal. Final grades will be available in August.

Transportation

- ◆ Transportation to and from Summer Programs is the responsibility of the student and/ or parent/ guardian.

Reminders

- ◆ All classes will take place in-person at GHS.
- ◆ Lunch will be available to all students at no cost.
- ◆ Programs are open to Garfield residents.
- ◆ Classes will run if 5 or more students are registered.
- ◆ Students who enroll in the Summer Experience program do have the option to earn course credit. Please see your counselor for more information.
- ◆ Any student registering for Credit Recovery courses must see their guidance counselor to ensure the correct class(es) have been selected.

COVID – 19 Guidelines

- ◆ All COVID –19 guidelines continue to be in effect and will be adjusted as new guidelines are implemented. Currently, all students:
 - 1)Must wear an appropriate face mask that covers both their nose and mouth.
 - 2)Must get their temperature taken at the door.
